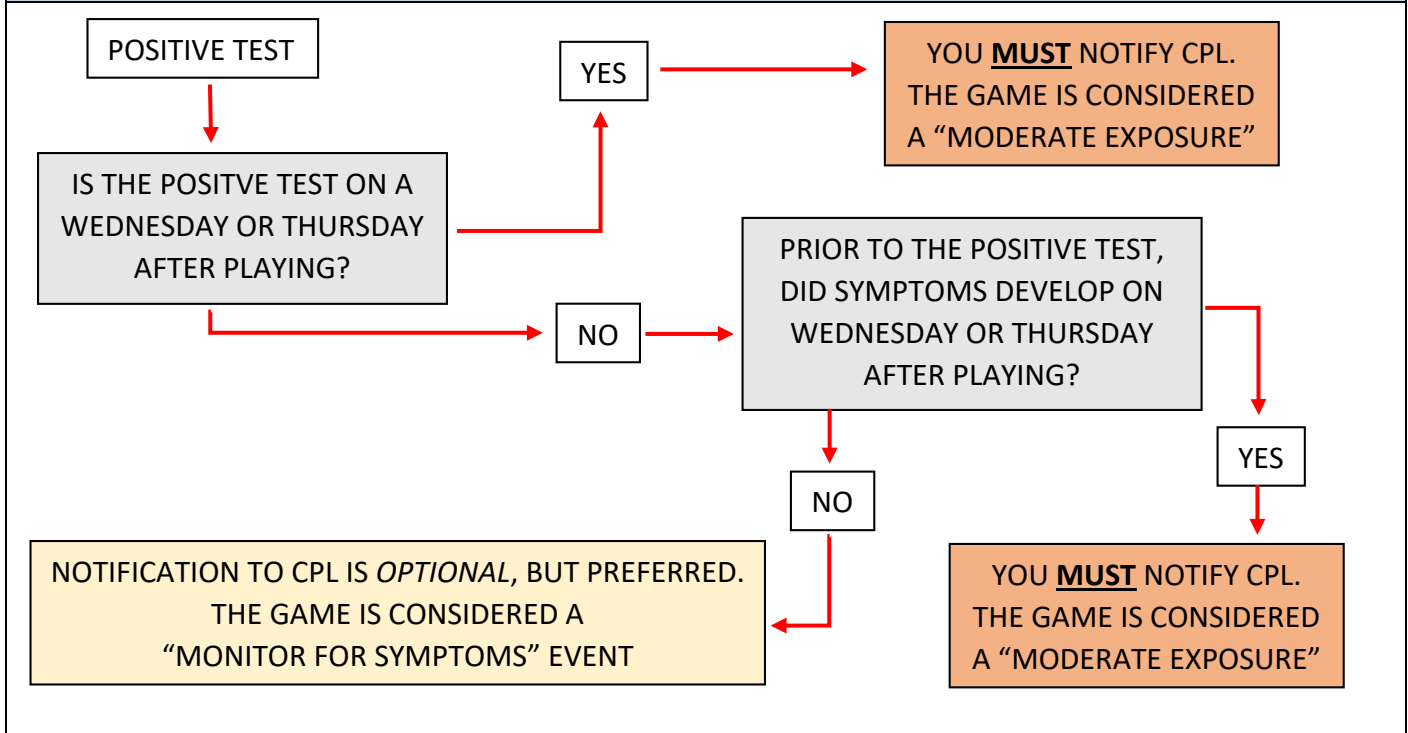




COVID-19 NOTIFICATION OF POSITIVE TEST RESULT AND GAME EXPOSURE REQUIREMENTS

EFFECTIVE AS OF 28 FEBRUARY 2022

I HAVE TESTED POSITIVE TO COVID-19 ON A RAT OR PCR TEST, NOW WHAT?



WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A GAME IS CONSIDERED A "MODERATE EXPOSURE"?

- The CPL will notify the two teams and update the CPL Website and Facebook page.
- Players from both teams are required to complete a COVID-19 RAT or PCR test ASAP, and quarantine until a negative result is received.
- On Day 6 (the first Monday after the game), players are then required to complete a subsequent COVID-19 RAT or PCR test.
- If the Day 6 test is negative, the player is eligible to play the next game (Day 7) provided they are not displaying any COVID-19 symptoms.

DO NOT ATTEND IF:

- You experience any of the following symptoms:
 - flu like symptoms, cough or sore throat;
 - fever, including hot or cold sweats; or
 - shortness of breath or other breathing difficulty.
- Directives from Health Authorities require you to isolate or quarantine.

CPL COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS ARE TAKEN SERIOUSLY. INDIVIDUALS WHO DO NOT COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE VENUE.

NON-COMPLIANCE MAY RESULT IN THE LOSS OF COMPETITION POINTS, MONETARY PENALTIES OR SUSPENSION FROM THE CPL.
